



Tent Information + Property Requirements

Thank you for considering us for your event! We'd be thrilled to work with you to make your celebration great. When it comes to tents, there are a few requirements and need-to-knows to ensure a smooth and successful tented experience, which we've laid out below.

Tent Site Requirements:

- The tent site should be flat and level.
- There should be at least (2) electrical outlets within 100 ft. of the tent, via building or generator.
- The actual tent location must be free of trees or any other objects. Tent must lay flat on the ground during installation.
- The tent site must be free of overhead objects, including power lines, tree branches, decks, hanging lights, etc.
- All underground utilities must be accounted for and marked.
- The site must be able to accommodate the size of the tent PLUS additional footage for stakes.
- We require clear and open access to the tent site.

Tent Staking:

- All of our tents are required to be staked into the ground with 42-inch metal stakes, connected by straps positioned 6-7 feet from the tent. This adds up to 14 ft. of width and length to the required site space. (i.e., a 32'x50' tent would require 46'x64' feet of space.)
 - Clients must account for this additional footage when deciding on a tent size/location, and confirm that the site has sufficient space.
- Stakes are installed with a sledgehammer or jackhammer and can easily damage underground utilities. We will contact Miss Utility to have the site marked for public utilities including power lines to the primary building, gas and communication lines.
- Miss Utility **does not** mark private utilities including the following:
 - Secondary power lines (Running to sheds, piers, landscaping lights, buildings, etc.)
 - Secondary gas lines (gas fire pits, outdoor kitchens, other buildings etc.)
 - Water lines from wells
 - Septic tanks
 - Irrigation systems

The client is responsible for having private utilities marked before our arrival for installation. If unsure of their location, we can help you find a private utility locator that can do this for you. Honeywood, LLC is not responsible for any damage to underground utilities.

Site Access for Install:

- Our team must be able to park our truck(s) within 50 ft. of the tent site.
- We require clear, open access to the property without stairs or any other obstacles.
- For installation, we use a mini front-loader called a Tent Ox, used to install the tent as well as carry heavy objects to and from the tent site. The Tent Ox has turf-safe tires and typically does not damage the grounds, but if the grass is wet it may leave tire lines. If you do not want this machine used, a fee will be applied to your contract for additional staff.
- Please note, if space is limited for parking we may need to park or drive on to your lawn/grass.
